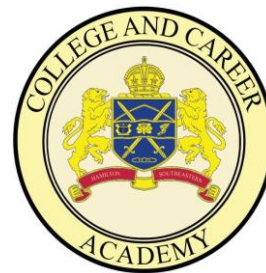

Hamilton Southeastern School Corporation

Hamilton Southeastern High School is a comprehensive 4-year high school located in Fishers, Indiana. Approximately 3,400 students are enrolled in grades 9-12. Total enrollment for the corporation is approximately 20,000. There are 2 high schools grades 9-12, four junior high schools, four intermediate schools and thirteen elementary schools that comprise the Hamilton Southeastern School Corporation which serves Wayne, Delaware and Fall Creek townships in the southeast corner of Hamilton County. The area's 2020 population of approximately 93,400 for the City of Fishers represents an explosion of growth from the 1980 population of 2,008.

Curriculum

The school year is divided into two semesters of eighteen weeks, each of which is subdivided into two nine-week grading periods. One credit is earned each semester. The school day consists of seven fifty-minute periods and a thirty-minute lunch period. Hamilton Southeastern High School provides offerings for a wide range of abilities and interests including 50 AP and Dual Credit classes and 17 Honors classes (see reverse side). Vocational courses are offered through the J. Everett Light Career Center located at North Central High School in Indianapolis.
